### Interesting to Note



**Our most precious are also our most vulnerable—please be sure that you are ~**

1. Using the correct size car seat for the age and weight of your child.
2. Infant should be in a **rear-facing car seat** until they are **at least 1 year of age**.
3. Using the car seat **EACH** and **EVERY** time you get into the car to go any distance.
4. Ensuring that all straps and belts/harnesses are in the correct place with the correct amount of tightness to hold in place.
5. Checking these from time to time to make sure that they haven't come loose.
6. Placing the car seat in the right spot – **NOT** the front seat of the car – ever!
7. Talking at all times (regardless of age) about how important it is that they remain buckled in, especially when the car is in motion.
8. Never leaving your child alone in the car – for any time!
9. Never holding them in your arms, on your lap, adapting a seat with cushions/pillows instead of the proper equipment.
