Did you know?

With Fall just around the corner, children may begin to experience some allergy symptoms related to Ragweed pollen which is the source for many common Fall allergy symptoms. It grows throughout the country and releases pollen from August to November. Typically, ragweed pollen counts are highest in mid-September. Mold is also a typical trigger for autumn allergies. The rotting leaves of fall provide an excellent home for mold growth, and it releases spores into the air to reproduce. These tiny spores are often the culprit for those runny noses and watery, itchy eyes you see in allergy sufferers. It is important to monitor your child for allergy symptoms and to know the difference between allergies and COVID-19 symptoms. Remember to follow Toronto Public Health guidelines to keep yourself and others safe.
